

Montessori Philosophy

- The basic principle is to "follow the child".
- A Montessori classroom is carefully prepared to allow the child to work independently and allow for the joy of self-discovery.



Practical Life


- Practical life in Montessori is purposeful activity
 - develops motor control and coordination
 - develops independence
 - concentration
 - sense of responsibility



The exercises in practical life cover two main areas of development: care of self, and care of the environment.

Language

- Montessori Language Sequence
 - Letter ID, Letter sounds, Beginning Sounds, Ending Sounds,
 - Middle Sounds (Vowels), Sounding out 3 letter words,
 - Word Building
- Benchmark
 - District wide literacy curriculum
- Leveled Literacy Intervention (LLI)
 - Intensive small group literacy intervention program focusing on reading and writing
- Reading
 - Weekly check out at school library
 - Every student has a leveled book bag taken home nightly





Math


- Montessori Math Sequence
 - Number ID, one to one correspondence, teen numbers, numbers from 30-100, comparing numbers (<,>,=), place value, addition, subtraction
- Eureka Squared Math
 - District wide math program that teaches the students to be able to compose and decompose numbers in multiple ways.
- Additional Topics taught
 - 3D shapes

Science

- Amplify Science Curriculum
- Montessori Animal Units
- Weather
- Social Studies
 - Citizenship
 - Past, Present, Future
 - Needs vs. Wants
 - Maps and Globes study










Field Trips

Who needs to be screened?

 Any incoming kindergarten student that is <u>not</u> currently enrolled in a GSRP program in Dearborn or Howe preschool.


When will we be screening the students?

- Families schedule a day and time that works best. The screener will take place at the end of May.
- Students that attend Howe preschool or have siblings in the building will be screened during the school day.


Why are we screening the incoming kindergarten students?

- We want to see where each child is currently at academically.
- We can give families some direction on what they can do at home to help their child succeed next school year.
- If a child is young and does not seem academically ready for Kindergarten, Y5
 classrooms are offered at Geer Park, Henry Ford, Lindbergh, Maples, Salina, and
 McCollough Unis.










What Happens in a Young 5s Kindergarten Classroom?

- * Classroom: 19 or fewer students
- * Length of school day: Full day of school, five days a week
- * Shared activities: They participate in all kindergarten activities
- * Curriculum and learning: Academic and social skills that build on previous learning
- * Learning environment: Children will build a strong language base

Students that attended Dearborn Public Schools' Young 5s program showed higher student achievement IN kindergarten and first grade compared to similarly-aged students that did not attend Young 5s.
